

**CITY OF UNION GAP, WASHINGTON**  
**RESOLUTION NO. 714**

A **RESOLUTION** establishing the process by which an approved ordinance or an approved resolution of the City Council may be brought to City Council for reconsideration and establishing a process by which previously codified ordinances and previously approved resolutions by prior City Councils may be brought to City Council for reconsideration.

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of the City Council to expeditiously resolve matters and to put matters to rest through the passage of ordinances and resolutions when necessary;

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire of the City Council to not engage in continued discussion and debate over matters that have been resolved through the passage of ordinances and resolutions;

**WHEREAS**, the City Council may, pursuant to RCW 35A.12.120, determine its own rules and order of business:

**NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF UNION GAP, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES as follows:**

1. When the City Council has decided a question or has resolved an issue that results in the passage of an ordinance or the adoption of a resolution, the matter which is the subject of the ordinance or the resolution may not be brought back to the City Council for reconsideration, unless a Council Member who voted in the majority when the ordinance was passed or when the resolution was adopted moves for a reconsideration of the ordinance or resolution and that Council Member's motion passes permitting the matter to be placed back on the City Council agenda for reconsideration.

2. Where a prior City Council has passed an ordinance or adopted a resolution, such an ordinance or resolution may not be placed on the City Council's agenda for reconsideration unless a current City Council member moves that the matter be placed on the City Council agenda and that motion passes.
