<b>Tourist Promotion Areas</b>	<a href="#">RCW</a> <a href="#">35.101.010(2)</a>  <a href="#">RCW</a> <a href="#">35.101.130</a>	Any county with a population greater than forty thousand but less than one million, or of any city or town within such a county	Legislative authority has sole discretion to determine how revenue will be used to promote tourism, but it may appoint existing advisory boards or commissions to make recommendations as to its use, or the legislative authority may create a new advisory board or commission for the [that] purpose.
<b>Citizen's Commission on Salaries for Elected Officials</b>	<a href="#">RCW</a> <a href="#">36.17.024</a>		Ten commissioners; 6 appointed by auditor from registered voters. In noncharter counties, 2 selected from each district; remaining 4 members have specific requirements and selection procedures by county executive or commissioners. Created by resolution or ordinance.
<b>Youth Agencies</b> -- to investigate, advise and act on, within the powers of that municipality, problems relating to the youth of that community town, or county	<a href="#">RCW</a> <a href="#">35.21.630</a>	Any city, town, or county; can contract to establish joint agency	Not specified
