<b>Lodging Tax Advisory Committee</b>	<a href="#">RCW 67.28.1817</a>	Any county, city or town that has imposed the hotel/motel (lodging) tax and has a population of 5000 or more	At least five members, appointed by the legislative body of the municipality, unless a charter provides for a different appointment authority. The committee membership shall include: (a) At least two members who are representatives of businesses required to collect tax (b) at least two members who are persons involved in activities authorized to be funded by revenue received. The number of members who are representatives of businesses required to collect tax shall equal the number of members who are involved in activities authorized to be funded by revenue received under this chapter. One member shall be an elected official of the municipality who shall serve as chair of the committee. An advisory committee for a county may include one nonvoting member who is an elected official of a city or town in the county. An advisory committee for a city or town may include one nonvoting member who is an elected official of the county in which the city or town is located. The appointing authority shall review the membership of the advisory committee annually and make changes as appropriate.

Where a municipality is governed by a board, the chair, one member of the board, and the secretary or clerk thereof shall serve as members of the fire fighter board of trustees in lieu of the mayor, clerk or comptroller, and
