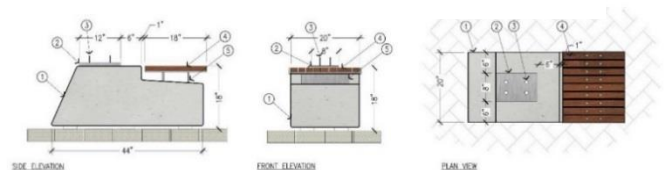
Become an exhibitor in the Park Lane Rotating Outdoor Sculpture Gallery

The City of Kirkland has been busy making great improvements to the Park Lane Corridor in Downtown Kirkland. These improvements enrich the heart of downtown with a beautiful walking corridor—already home to many popular restaurants, galleries, and boutique shopping locations—from the Kirkland Transit Center to Central Avenue.

Many festivals use Park Lane as an enhancement to their event like the popular art and music festival Summerfest (50k), art and wine festival Uncorked (40k), the legendary Classic Car Show (20k), the holiday tradition Winterfest (10k), and the ever-popular 4th of July (45k). These uses will increase with the new enhancements, and along with the monthly Art Walk and regular shopping traffic, exposure opportunities will be truly abundant.

Fostering artist exposure, and public art, through the City of Kirkland's 1% for the Arts contribution the Kirkland Cultural Arts Commission (KCAC) helped arrange six plinths on which outdoor-ready large art pieces can be displayed on a rotational basis. These plinths are available on a yearly "lease" for a modest fee and includes informational plaques on purchasing the art. (Sales would be through gallery or artist). The KCAC will select artwork from qualified applications and encourages multiple submissions.

Park Lane Rotating Outdoor Sculpture Gallery Exhibitor Application

The Kirkland Cultural Arts Commission seeks temporary art sculptures for Park Lane. Park Lane features six display pedestals that have a surface area of 18 inches x 20 inches intended to exhibit sculptures that are “for sale” in the outdoor, public gallery space. The Cultural Arts Commission will review and select pieces to be displayed for a 12 month period. When a piece sells, it will be replaced by a piece pre-approved by the Cultural Arts Commission. 100% of the sale goes to the artist or gallery.

If selected, a year-long lease of \$350 is required and covers City installation and removal of the art. If special equipment is needed for installation and removal, additional fees may apply.

Applications should be submitted to Philly Hoshko via email at phoshko@kirklandwa.gov or mail to 123 5th Ave Kirkland, WA 98033. Sculptures will be selected by the Cultural Arts Commission on a rolling basis. A short term Sculpture Display Agreement must be signed prior to install of artwork (Exhibit A).
