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**RESOLUTION NO. R2006-138s** 

A Resolution of the Pierce County Council Stating Council Intent Regarding Street Illumination and Requesting the Department of Public Works and Utilities to Modify Title 17B and the Manual on Design Guidelines and Specifications for Road and Bridge **Construction in Pierce County Accordingly.** 

Whereas, the Pierce County Council desires to provide street illumination along multi-lane arterials within the urban area, along pedestrian routes to public schools and parks, areas of dense concentration of commercial and multifamily development, signalized intersections, and other specific areas, for traffic and pedestrian safety and crime deterrence purposes; and

Whereas, the Council has provided funding for installation of utility service provider lighting within specific communities, and in proximity to schools in past budget years; and

Whereas, the Department of Public Works and Utilities estimates that there are approximately 41 miles of collector, secondary, and major arterials containing more than two lanes within the urban area; and

Whereas, a number of miles of these arterials are planned to be illuminated pursuant to Pierce County's Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program; and

Whereas, it is estimated by the Department of Public Works and Utilities Department, that remaining arterials will cost an estimated \$6.2 million to illuminate; and

**Whereas**, the Council recently adopted the Traffic Impact Fee Program, Ordinance No. 2006-60s which is anticipated to generate approximately \$3.7 million in revenue for street illumination along specific roadways, over a twenty year period; and

 **Whereas**, the Council desires that the illumination of these roadways be included in the Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program beginning in 2007, subject to available funding; and

**Whereas**, the Council also desires that street illumination in other areas as identified through adopted policy also be provided, subject to available funding;

**Whereas**, the Council desires to state clear policies regarding future street illumination; Now Therefore,

## BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Pierce County:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Pierce County Council hereby sets forth a policy that street lighting be provided as a means of enhancing traffic and pedestrian safety at locations that are identified, authorized, and funded by the County Council in the following types of areas:

- A. Established walking routes to a specific public school,
- B. Walking routes to a specific public park, or
- C. Other locations determined in consultation with a school district or law enforcement agency for student safety or crime deterrence purposes.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Pierce County Council also hereby states a policy that continuous street lighting as a part of all major construction or reconstruction road projects on major, secondary, and collector County arterials that are:

- A. Located in areas with a highly dense concentration of urban commercial development, and in areas that have a significant concentration of both commercial and high density multifamily development. Typical locations would be those areas adjacent to the County road system that are designated as Major Urban Centers or Community Centers by the County Comprehensive Plan, or
- B. More than two lanes in width and located in an urban growth area, or
- C. More than two lanes in width and located in rural areas that exhibit an urban growth pattern and urban density and are specifically identified and authorized by the County Council.
